## ❖ Click It or Ticket

Drivers can be stopped and ticketed if an officer sees an unrestrained or improperly restrained child in the vehicle. The fine is a minimum of \$82 per violation.

## ❖ Back Seat is Best

All children under age 13 should ride in the back seat and must be properly restrained at all times.

<b>Seat</b>	 <p><b>Rear-Facing Car Seats</b></p>	 <p><b>Forward-Facing Car Seats</b></p>	 <p><b>High Back or Backless Booster Seats</b></p>	 <p><b>Lap and Shoulder Seat Belts</b></p>
<b>Age</b>	<p><b>Newborn to age 3</b> (keep rear-facing as long as possible)</p>	<p><b>Age 2 to 5</b></p>	<p><b>Age 4 to 12</b> (or until seatbelt fits properly)</p>	<p><b>Older than age 8</b> (for some kids, not until age 12)</p>
<b>Weight/Height</b>	<p>Use seat to maximum manufacturer-recommended weight or height, and follow instructions from your vehicle's owner's manual.</p>			<p>When seat belt fits properly.</p>

2. Check online to see if your car seat has been recalled.
3. Car seats that have been in a crash, even if they look fine, are no longer safe.
